What is HPV?

Human papillomavirus (HPV) is the most common sexually transmitted infection (STI)

Some types of HPV cause GENITAL WARTS

Without the HPV vaccine, up to 75% of sexually active women will have **AT LEAST ONE** HPV infection in their lifetime

Most cases of HPV have NO SYMPTOMS,

but the virus can still be passed to a partner



HPV CAUSES:

93% of anal cancers

91% of cervical cancers

75% of vaginal cancers

70% of throat cancers

69% of vulvar cancers

How Can I REDUCE My Risk?

Using a barrier (condom or dental dam) every time for oral, anal, or vaginal sex will **REDUCE** but **NOT ELIMINATE** your risk

Routine cervical screening using a PAP TEST is NECESSARY to find CERVICAL CANCER before symptoms develop
